



Handwashing

Policy: Staff and children will follow routine Handwashing Procedures.

Staff, Volunteers, and Children must wash hands:

- **Upon** arrival for the day.
- When hands are soiled.
- Before & After eating, preparing and serving food and beverage and feeding children.
- After a child brushes their teeth.
- Before and After playing in the water that is shared by two or more people.
- Before & After each diapering.
- After toilet use or helping a child use the toilet.
- After handling bodily fluids.
- After handling pets, pet cages, or other pet objects.
- After playing in sand, on wooden play sets, and outdoors.

Staff and Volunteers must also wash their hands:

- **Prior** to the care of children and after breaks
- Before & After giving medication or applying a medical ointmentor cream.
- After handling garbage or cleaning.
- After cleaning and disinfecting the diaper changing surface.
- Before & After wearing non-porous (e.g., Latex) gloves used for any purpose.
- Before & After helping a child brush teeth.

Nontoxic, disposable wipes may be used in the following situations:

- When the child is too heavy to hold for handwashing.
- When the child cannot stand safely at the sink.
- When the child is not developmentally ready to hold their head.
- When the child has a special need and is not able to washtheir own hands.
- NOTE: Only wipes intended for use on skin can be used. Household cleaning wipes must not be used.

How to wash hands:

- Use liquid soap and warm running water.
- Moisten hands with water and apply a heavy lather of liquid soap.
- Rub hands together vigorously until a soapy lather appears and continue for at least 20 seconds. (This is not done under running water).
- Pay attention to areas between fingers, around nail beds, under finger nails, and backs of hands.
- Rinse hands well under running water until hands are free of soap and dirt. Leave the water running while drying hands.
- **Dry** hands with a single paper towel.
- Use paper towel to turn off the faucet.
- Discard paper towel.
- When soap and running water are not available during an outing, hand sanitizers, or single-use wipes (intended for use on skin) may be used as a temporary measure.

Increased handwashing may be necessary throughout the day.

Guidelines for handwashing shall be posted in the food preparation area, in toilet rooms, in diapering areas and by all hand washing sinks.
